1. Call to Order and Introductions: Meeting was called to order by Chairman Loka.
2. Election of Officers:
 - a. Chairperson: Motion by Zeitz, seconded by Swanson nominating Loka as chairperson. Called three times for any other nominations, no other nominations. Cast a unanimous ballot for Loka as Chairperson. Motion Carried. All ayes.
 - b. Vice-Chairperson: Motion by Loka, seconded by Swanson to nominate Bill Zeitz for vice chairperson. Called three times for any other nominations, no other nominations. Cast a unanimous ballot for Zeitz as Vice-Chairperson. Motion Carried. All ayes.
 - c. Secretary: Motion by Zeitz, seconded by Voermans to nominate Sue Weith for secretary. Called three times for any other nominations, no other nominations. Cast a unanimous ballot for Weith as Secretary. Motion Carried. All ayes.
3. Loka thanked her for the many years of service. Motion by Loka, seconded by Swanson to reappoint both Weith and Dr. Moore to the Board for another term. Motion Carried. All ayes.
4. Immunization Program Update-Mindy Schwarz, Public Health Nurse: VFC Site Visit-complaint vaccine management plan. 2016 Performance Management Goals-HPV – 44% of 13-18 year olds; Vaccine temperatures; staff training. Zeitz pointed out 19 shots by age 2.

Zeitz wanted to add in the minutes that one of the Board of Health members complained about his city water on his property. Motion by Swanson, seconded by Zeitz to approve the amended minutes. Public Health

- Advertisement for public health nurse position is in process. Deadline for applications is June 29th.
- Board of Health is invited to celebrate our 100th Anniversary of Lincoln County Health Department on July 27th at 4:00 p.m. (see enclosed invite)
- We received around \$3,000 in extra funding this year from the preparedness state grant for staff training.

Healthy People Lincoln County – Health Plan

- Health Department is hosting Mental Health First Aid Trainings. This training is to give organization skills to work with clients that have a mental health issue prior to connecting with a medical provider. There is a shortage of Mental Health providers in Lincoln County thus this training is very beneficial. (see attached flyer).
- Community Garden is up and running. The shed and fence is in place. We are waiting for water hook up. We anticipating in receiving a grant from Good Samaritan for \$2500 to put towards items needed in the garden. Plots that are not rented are planted with donated plants from Lincoln Hills. We have 13, 4x10 plots rented out and 2, 4x8 plots.

Public Health Preparedness

- Staff completed Public Health Capabilities Assessment. This determines future staff training needs.

Environmental Health

- More than 50% of licensing renewals have been paid by establishments. This year we do not have a grace period for those renewals that do not pay by June 30th. They will be charged an \$85 late fee.

Accreditation



Senate Approves Update to Toxic Chemical Legislation

The Senate passed by voice vote this week the House-Senate negotiated bill that represents the first update to the "Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976" in almost 40 years. The "Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act" ([H.R. 2576](#)) now heads to the President's desk, where it is expected to be signed. Following years of negotiations and false starts, the final bill removes barriers to the ability of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to review and regulate chemicals commonly found in household goods. It would, however, preempt state oversight of commercial chemicals.

House Passes Bill to Postpone Ozone Regulation Implementation

The House passed the "Ozone Standards Implementation Act" ([H.R. 4775](#)), authored by Rep. Pete Olson (R-TX), to give states additional time (from 2017 to 2025) and flexibility to implement new ozone and other National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). Two amendments were attached to bill; one authored by Rep. Paul Gosar (R-AZ) that would ensure that the study on Ozone formation contained in the bill analyzes the relative contribution from wildfires, and the other amendment from Rep. Ed Whitfield (R-KY) that would provide that no additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry out the requirements of the Act and the amendments. NACCHO and a coalition of public health groups opposed the bill because of the attempt to delay clean air standards. In a Statement of Administration Policy, the President's senior advisors stated that they would recommend he veto this bill.

Senators Offering Public Health Amendments to Defense Bill

Senators Barbara Mikulski (D-MD) and Jack Reed (D-RI) offered an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act on the Senate floor yesterday to increase both defense and non-defense discretionary funding by \$18 billion each. The amendment would also fund the president's \$1.9 billion emergency funding request for Zika, \$1.1 billion to address the opioid crisis and \$1.9 billion for water infrastructure upgrades for communities like Flint. The Senate voted 43-55 against moving the amendment forward.

Senators Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Michael Bennet (D-CO) announced their intent to offer the "Promise for Antibiotics and Therapeutics for Health (PATH) Act" ([S. 185](#)) as an amendment. The PATH Act would establish a new limited population antibacterial drug (LPAD) approval pathway for antibiotics to treat serious or life-threatening infections for which there exists an unmet medical need.

Senators Ask Naloxone Makers about Price Increases

Senators Susan Collins (R-ME) and Claire McCaskill (D-MO) wrote to Amphaster Pharmaceuticals, Pfizer, Adapt Pharmaceuticals, Kaléo Pharma, and Mylan on Friday asking about the reasons behind price changes for their versions of Naloxone and how the companies are working to prevent shortages of the antidote.



School Health Services Agreement 2016-2017 School Year Grades 4K through 12

Purpose

This agreement is entered into to identify the services and responsibilities of Merrill Area Public Schools and the Lincoln County Health Department (LCHD) for the provision of school health services in the district schools. Delivery of service will be provided by the Health Department's bachelor prepared, public health nurses (PHN) with overall direction from the LCHD Director.

"Regular school hours" are defined as on-site school hours that occur from 8 AM to 3 PM (Monday through Friday) from the first to last day of regular instruction (usually early September to early June).

Administration and Consultation Health Services

1. Consult with school administrator on health related matters including interpretation and implementation of DPI standards and State Statutes that relate to school health services (for regular school hours only), emergency nursing services, medication administration, training and delegation of staff, and immunization compliance.
2. In cooperation with school administration, develop emergency nursing policies and review annually.
3. Provide all necessary equipment needed for the public health nurse (i.e. stethoscope, sphygmomanometer and cuffs, audiometers, visual acuity charts, and otoscope).
4. ~~Identify and~~ Develop/provide information for school staff and parents, as necessary, in regard to school health issues. (i.e. on diseases, medications, treatment methods, ~~school health issues~~, etc.).
5. Assist in developing a district records system for ~~maintaining~~ maintenance and transfer of medical records and maintain individual health records created by the public health nurse.
6. Provide public health nurses training opportunities as available (webinars, conferences, journal reading, etc.) LCHD is a member of the National and State Associations of school nursing.

Preventive Health Services

1. Case finding of students with health needs and referrals for services.
2. Provide hearing screening for Kindergarten (K) and first grade. Assist in training volunteers to provide vision screening for K, 1st, 3rd, and 5th grade. Referral for health screening programs will be completed including assisting parents/guardians to resolve barriers to follow-up care.
3. Consultation to school staff regarding communicable disease control as defined in HSS 252.
4. Train designated school personal to screen students with head lice. Public health nurse follow-up will be done per MAPS policy 453.1.

5. Consult with school staff regarding clarification of the immunization law and individual student immunization records. Collaborate with school staff to complete the WI School Immunization Audit and provide follow up on students needing further immunizations.
6. Provide individual health counseling for students on health related issues.
7. Provide classroom health education presentations on Human Growth and Development with assistance from MAPS staff or independently.
8. Provide health resources to staff, parents and students, as needed, regarding school health issues. (i.e. information on diseases, medications, treatment methods, etc.)
9. ~~Faculty and~~ Provide staff ~~in-service~~ training on health-related topics, as time permits.

Emergency Nursing Services

Services provided when the public health nurse is on site at the individual school. Public Health Nurses will provide consultation for urgent, non-emergent student health issues as available. ~~are available to MAPS staff outside regular school nursing hours for consultation~~

- ~~1. Assist school personnel with assessment of students with acute problems.~~
2. Public Health Nurses are only available for consultation during regular health department hours, 8-430.
3. The public health nurse will not be available to respond to emergency situations unless on-site at the time of the emergency. ~~The Lincoln County Health Department will not provide coverage for emergency nursing services during school events.~~
4. See MAPS Emergency Nursing Services Administrative Rule 453.1.

Students with Special Health Care Needs Services

Assistance is available on a limited basis. The nature of the nursing services provided in this area is advisory with nurses providing assessment and planning services and training of personnel in procedures to implement care plans.

1. Communicate with student, parents and staff regarding health care needs.
2. Provide student assessment; develop individual health care plans (IHP) as needed; train and delegate to school personnel in procedures necessary to implement IHPs during regular school hours; and provide ongoing assessment, evaluation and revisions of IHPs as necessary.
3. Provide professional nursing assessment, follow-up, and referral to students with acute and chronic health conditions.
4. Provide services listed under this section for the 4k program.
5. LCHD does not provide health services to any school-based or sponsored events ~~of~~ for students outside of regular school hours with special health care needs which include formulation of individual health plans, staff delegation, and oversight. Examples of these events include summer school, class trips, homework club, sports practices, and clubs including before and after the school day and on weekends.

Medication Administration

Administration of medication is the responsibility of school staff. The only legal requirement for nurse involvement in medication administration in a school is for assistance with policy development. The nurse can act as a consultant to school personnel who are updating medication policies and procedures to follow current best practice standards. The school is responsible for designating to school staff the task of administering prescription, non-prescription and PRN (as needed) medication according to school policy.

Delegation

1. The public health nurse will provide training, documentation of the training, intermittent oversight and annual review of school staff delegated to provide procedures during regular school hours, ~~and discuss concerns with administration.~~

2. The public health nurse will assess staff competence to perform required procedures and discuss concerns with administration. In the event that the public health nurse deems as the assigned individual incompetent to complete delegated nursing tasks the district will immediately provide different personnel.
3. Training will be documented.
4. ~~Training may be requested and provided (as able) to personnel assigned delegated tasks during regular school hours.~~

Accommodations

The school will provide a private area for the nurse for confidential health services.

Access to Public Records

The Lincoln County public health nurse will have access to pertinent health related student records.

Professional Liability

Lincoln County assumes professional liability for the negligent acts of county public health personnel performing their specific job duties. It is understood that Lincoln County's Public Health program cannot respond to the total school health service needs of Merrill Area Public Schools. The Health Department intends to cooperate and coordinate with school personnel in providing related services but Lincoln County assumes no liability for the acts or omissions of school employees.

School District Responsibilities

1. Ensure that the emergency nursing services are provided through consultation with the public health nurse. Review emergency nursing policy and procedures prior to the beginning of each school year according to State Statute.
2. Ensure that a licensed physician serves as District Medical Advisor.
3. Provide a method for parents/guardians to ~~fill out~~ complete and return Health Information forms within 10 days of the beginning of the school year.
4. ~~Provide a method for~~ Assure that parents and guardians ~~to fill out or turn in~~ complete/access and return immunization documentation for all incoming students within 10 days of the beginning of the school year or within 10 days of starting schooling. (i.e. kindergarteners, new students, transfer students to be given to nurse for completion of immunization audit.)
5. Ensure staff participation in required trainings according to WI Statute for the delegation of special health care services and medication administration.
6. Notify the public health nurse of any or all ~~requiring~~ health care concerns requiring nursing follow-up and any medications administered during the regular school hours.
7. Assure the school medication policy and procedures follow current best practice standards mandated by Wisconsin Statute.
8. Assign and provide adequate time for delegated staff to attend and complete training(s) for health care tasks by the school nurse.
9. Ensure accident and medication administration error reports are completed and sent to appropriate administrative and nursing personnel for review.
10. Assure that emergency nursing services are available for all school-sponsored events during the regular school hours as well as outside regular school hours. (i.e. school trips, extra-curricular activities, ~~summer school~~).
11. Designate personnel to maintain current certification for first aid, CPR and Automated External Defibrillator and provide necessary equipment.

12. Collaborate with public health nurse on the crisis plan for each school.
13. Ensure that staff is maintaining health records and health logs according to WI Statute.
14. Collaborate with health department staff to schedule and implement screening/re-screening for vision and hearing. Assist with recruitment of volunteers to assist with screening.
15. Order and maintain first aid supplies.
16. Collaborate with public health nurse on implementing Human Growth and Development curriculum.
17. Maintain DPI approved medication training records for staff and provide a timely copy to public health nurses as trainings are completed.
18. Communicate all policies and procedures related to health, safety, and the emergency nursing services to building staff.
19. Maintain and transfer medical records according to WI State Statute.
20. Complete DPI data reports for school health services.

Contracted Services

The District agrees to pay Lincoln County Health Department \$100,440 for school nursing services for grades K-12 during the 2016-2017 school year during regular School Hours: Approximate 8 a.m. - 300 p.m.; Monday through Friday; 1st and Last day of instruction

1. The amount of nursing service time available to the District shall be no less than 1.3 FTE, calculated as 2,080 hours per year for a total of 2232 hours per fiscal year. 1969 hours includes direct services to children, contact with parents and staff, consultations with school staff, follow-up on health concerns, case plan development and training of staff. 263 hours includes travel, program consultation, program planning and evaluation, data collection, paperwork, supplies and equipment. Services to MADA or NAC are not provided in this contract. Assistance with the Bridges Virtual Academy Immunization Audit is included in the above hours with an additional 25 hours.
2. Direct service hours to be delivered at each 4K school will be recommended by LCHD staff and coordinated with the District's Director of Special Education/Pupil Services and MAPS 4K Administrator. Services will be provided to the 4K MAPS service population as directed by the District's Director of Special Education/Pupil Services and will be billed at \$45 per hour.
3. A schedule of nursing times will be provided to each District principal and the District administrative offices. These hours will be determined based on student acuities and are subject to change during the school year.
4. LCHD will bill the district quarterly for services.
5. This agreement may be canceled and terminated by either party hereto provided written notice of intention is provided sixty (30) days prior to date of cancellation.
6. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Agreement, the District agrees to hold Lincoln County harmless for failure to perform any services by reason of cutbacks in financial resources, staff, equipment, or supplies caused by action of the Lincoln County Board of Health, Lincoln County Board of Supervisors, or state or federal funding sources.
7. This written contract is one which all parties agree to be the final complete and integrated expression of the agreement. Except as specifically stated in this agreement, no outside or additional terms or conditions exist. This agreement is an integrated final contract of the parties, superseding all prior

verbal statements of any representative or agent of the parties. Any modification of this agreement must be in writing.

8. Neither party may assign this agreement or any of its rights or duties without the other party's prior written consent.
9. Both parties hereby agree to specifically comply with all state, federal and local law prohibiting discrimination by reason of race, color, religion, sex or national origin during the terms of this contract.
10. Each party shall abide in all aspects with local, state, and federal laws, rules and regulations which concern the operation of municipal entities, including specifically laws concerning equal opportunity, anti-discrimination, and specifically HIPAA. This agreement is an intergovernmental contract authorized pursuant to Chapter 66 of Wisconsin Statutes. Wisconsin law shall govern the interpretation and construction of this agreement.
11. If any portion of this Agreement is held to be invalid, such provision shall be considered severable, and the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected.
12. By execution of the agreement, both parties agree that they have read and understood all terms of this agreement. For purposes of construction, this agreement shall be deemed to have been drawn jointly and equally by the parties to it. Each party has read the agreement and certifies that it will comply with all its terms and conditions and that the official executing the agreement has lawful authority to bind the party. Further, each party will retain an original copy of this agreement.

**Addendum
Delegation and Training**

This addendum further describes Lincoln County Health Department (LCHD) and Merrill Area Public Schools (MAPS) role and responsibilities for delegation and training of MAPS's employees for the purposes of addressing health issues of MAPS's students.

Lincoln County Health Department's role and responsibility is as follows:

- LCHD public health nurses can provide delegation to staff for the purposes of care of a MAPS enrolled student during regular school hours. "Regular school hours" are defined as on-site school hours that occur from 8 AM to 3 PM (Monday through Friday) from the first to last day of regular instruction (usually early September to early June).
- LCHD public health nurses can provide "training only" of MAPS employees for the purpose of health care for a MAPS enrolled student outside of the regular school hours (example field trips occurring after 3:00 p.m., summer school, etc.). LCHD is not available for consultation after the regular school hours.

Merrill Area Public Schools role and responsibility is as follows:

- It is the responsibility of MAPS's administration to have policies and procedures in place to address the health care of students during regular school hours and during after school events such as field trips occurring after 3:00 p.m., summer school, etc.
- Policies and procedures will include a process for parents and or providers to take on the role of delegation to MAPS's employees for their child's care during after school events occurring after 3:00 p.m.
- If LCHD training is being requested by MAPS for their employees it will be requested at least 2 weeks prior to the field trip or school sponsored event date.
