Four Convenience stores in Lincoln County implemented strategies to increase and market healthy food options in their stores in 2015, such as the new shelf display pictured here. These include:



Healthier Options at Grocery Stores: **"Best Picks" labeling system at Dave's County Market**

Dave's County Market has labeled the healthiest foods in their store, to help customers identify the "Best Picks" for their plates. A kick-off was held in March, 2015, with 6 fruit and vegetable baskets, donated by **Russ Davis Wholesale**, given away as prizes.

Some examples of "Best Picks" foods include fresh fruits and vegetables, lower salt and lower sugar prepared fruits and vegetables (including juices), whole grain foods, reduced fat dairy and meat products.

Community Garden Grant

The Lincoln County Health Department received a \$50,000 grant from the UW-SMPH, office of the Wisconsin Partnership program, to achieve the following objectives over 2 years:

1. To create, expand, maintain, promote and sustain community gardens.
2. To develop community member’s social connectedness to their community.
3. To educate the community how to garden, eat healthy and prepare foods.

Since the grant was received, in September 2015, a dedicated Community Garden Planning Subcommittee has developed a strategic work plan, which initiated the development of a Merrill Community Garden, with 40 plots, located next to Pine Crest Nursing Home.

2nd Annual Sugar Day-☺ut

In celebration of February Dental Health Month 2015, the Lincoln County Oral Health Coalition asked families and individuals to take the **Sugar Out Day** pledge to reduce the sugar they eat and drink for the day.


Results of the Campaign are as follows:

- ☺ Students increased their knowledge on sugar's effect on their teeth through community presentations at **Tomahawk Elementary, Washington Elementary, Jefferson Elementary and Pine River School for the Young Learners**. Students also pledged to be sugar free for the week of February 23rd.
- ☺ A **presentation** was provided to parents at the Pine River School for the Young Learners as well as Washington Elementary Lighted School House.
- ☺ **12 Dental offices** received a mailing encouraging their office to participate in Sugar Out Day.
- ☺ All public schools received a copy of the **Sugar Out Day Elementary School Tool Kit**.
- ☺ 4th graders in Merrill Area schools received a **dental hygiene packet from Ministry Health**.
- ☺ **26 Community members pledged** to be Sugar Free for the week of February 23rd.



Dental Sealants 2014-2015 School Year

Lincoln County Health Department provides free dental sealants to all second, third, sixth and seventh graders in public schools. During the 2014-2015 school year 301 students participated in this program.



Lincoln County Oral Health Coalition members are committed to community fluoridated water through the promotion of an agency endorsement.

Circle of Support for mental health

HOPELINE is a free service provided by the Center for Suicide Awareness. It is the first Emotional Support Text Line in Wisconsin and provides service throughout the entire state.

HOPELINE Promotional Efforts:

- HOPELINE posters/cards distributed to schools in Lincoln County (middle and high schools) and various coalition members.
- HOPELINE ads aired at the Merrill Cosmo Theater in December 2015 and January 2016.
- HOPELINE promoted via social media (Lincoln County Health Department, Parenting Support Network, etc.)

“Be SAFE” Safe, Affirming and Fair Environments

(4/23/15) Curriculum from Michigan State University Extension designed to help young people, ages 11 to 14, and adults work in partnership to create environments that are physically and emotionally safe. UW-Extension sponsored the training.




Our Burden of Suicide...

Data from “The Burden of Suicide in Wisconsin” (2007-2011), released 2014:

- 28 Suicides (rate*: 21.2 vs WI at 14)
- 77 Inpatient Hospitalizations (rate 58.3 vs WI at 112)
- 63 Emergency Department visits (rate 47.4 vs WI at 53) * Per 100,000 people



County Suicide Rates per 100,000



Key Findings – Statewide:

- Adults aged 45-54 experience the highest suicide rate by age.
- Nearly 4 out of 5 people who die by suicide are male.
- Firearms was the most used method.

Live Sustainable, Lincoln County's mission is to help people lead more environmentally friendly, fair and economical lives, for the good of their families, their community and the planet. Oral Health Coalition

Dr. Jennifer Freyer, DDS is a Dentist at the Bridge Community Dental Clinic. For those that know Dr. Freyer, you know that she is a public health champion in our community through her commitment and determination in bettering the health of others. In 2015, Dr. Freyer's commitment to oral health included multiple presentations in the community on oral health and healthy eating. This included presentations at the Pine River School for the Young Learners, Washington Lighted School House, Jefferson Elementary, and Washington Elementary. She also assisted in the developing educational publications on oral hygiene including the translation of materials into Spanish as well as advocating for healthy snacks in schools.



Mental Health Coalition

Debi Trader, Behavioral Health Liaison for North Central Health Care and member of the Lincoln County Mental Health Coalition completed Mental Health First Aid Instructor Training in October. She is now able to provide Mental Health First Aid Training to the community. Mental Health First Aid Training teaches participants how to help someone who is developing a mental illness or in a crisis. Individuals learn about: (1) Risk factors and warning signs for mental health and addiction concerns (2) Strategies for how to help someone in both crisis and non-crisis situations (3) Local resources and where to turn for help.
