1. Call to order and Introductions
Meeting was called to order by Hersil
2. Approve Minutes of Previous Meeting
Approval of last meetings minutes by Krueger, second by Wells. All ayes, motion carried.
3. LWL Operations
 - a. Donation Requests
Bentz wants Hersil to remind coalitions that there are donation dollars available for coalitions. Wells mentioned a suggestion would be to have a food package go home to all home meal participants for emergencies. ADRC could fill out a project application form.
 - b. Mini-grant template
Hersil shared the template of a project application form. This can be used by coalitions that get request for dollars for projects. Wells suggested would include the health priorities on the top of the form as well as what goal that this project addresses. Hersil will add to the form and send out to members.
 - c. Process for reviewing Legislation related to priorities
Each coalition now has a legislative point person. Positive feedback on having this as a standing item on coalition agendas. Hersil reminder members that the coalition cannot endorse action on legislation unless the Board of Health endorses the legislation first.
4. Data Collection

YRBS Review

Moellendorf reviewed the YRBS data for Lincoln County High School and Middle School. This data is available on the DPI website. You can also view data for Cesa 9. Coalitions should consider updating their key indicators with any data that might apply. It is important to not compare the 2017 YRBS data with 2019. The data is not comparable.

 - a. Collection of Quantitative Data
Discussion occurred on updating our action plans this spring – May/April. Suggestion from members would be to do a coalition survey with a follow-up discussion at the coalition meeting. Part of this discussion would include a brief over view of health equity from the

health department. Hersil will work on drafting questions and share with members to get feedback. Items for the review may include – documenting any changes in 2019 that affect the action plan- example vaping, strengths and opportunities for improvement, review of goals. Wells mentioned that the county health rankings will have health equity data when it is released in 2020. Members recommend formatting coalition agendas by goals. Healthy Minds does this as an example.

Bath shared how she is collecting qualitative data for the mental health coalition in 2020. Williams did share the hospitals will be updating their CHIP which could lead to more collection of qualitative data.

5. Community Training Needs

a. Health Equity

Hersil reviewed a document sharing how community engagement, partnerships, leadership, data and evaluation, and strategic planning activities can support health equity efforts.

6. Other Updates

a. Good Samaritan Health fair April 25 at 10:00 a.m.

Members shared there is a Tomahawk Sports Show in April as well as Children Festival in Merrill.
