Funding Extension Efforts

In 2021, the University of Wisconsin will contribute an estimated \$126,000 in direct funding for staff. Additionally, the FoodWise Nutrition Education Program will bring in \$76,000 in federal grant dollars to Lincoln County.

Based on 2019 actual leveraged dollars, another approximately \$325,000 is projected to be leveraged in 2021 (volunteer time, grants, and donations) to carry out local programming.

For every county dollar invested in support of Extension in Lincoln County, staff and the university return on average an estimated \$5 in leveraged donations, grants, fees, contracts, and volunteer time annually.

PURPOSE to which we commit...

We teach, learn, lead and serve, connecting people with the University of Wisconsin, and engaging with them in transforming lives and communities.

We transform lives, organizations and communities by:

- · creating stronger economies;
- · building resilient and productive environments;
- · addressing food safety, food security and health; and
- by building thriving youth, families, organizations and communities.

The Division of Extension, Lincoln County office is one of seventy-one county Extension offices statewide, staffed by professional educators. We offer educational programs through five program areas: Agriculture; Community Development; Health & Well-Being; 4-H; and Youth Development. FoodWise nutrition education is also offered through the office and is supported by an annual, renewable federal grant.

Extension staff are Faculty and Academic Staff members of the University of Wisconsin, Madison employed by a cooperative arrangement between the University and the County. Staff provide a direct link to the University of Wisconsin expertise and research. This university affiliation provides counties with access to community assessment tools, program evaluation expertise, a statewide network of program professionals, a source of professional development, and access to University of Wisconsin programs.

Embedded in our programming are strong partnerships. Working with government agencies, community groups, schools, organizations and individuals, Extension staff creatively engage others in our work. These partnerships enable us to reach county residents where they live and work, promoting life-long learning. During 2019, staff had 4,595 direct learner contacts in Lincoln County. This figure does not include indirect contacts through staff radio interviews, newspaper articles, websites, blogs and social media.
