A RESOLUTION PROHIBITING THE ADOPTION OF ANY POLICY THAT MANDATES THE COVID-19 VACCINE FOR LINCOLN COUNTY EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, on September 9, 2021 President Biden signed two executive orders related to the federal government’s efforts to lessen the impacts of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the first Order mandates each federal agency implement a program to require COVID-19 vaccination for all federal employees, with exceptions only as required by law;

WHEREAS, the second Order affects businesses that contract with the federal government and directs executive departments and federal agencies to include new clauses in federal contracts which will require compliance with guidance from the Safer Federal Workforce Task Force regarding COVID-19 vaccinations.

WHEREAS, it is estimated that these federal orders will affect over 80 million Americans;

WHEREAS, we the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors, have confidence in Lincoln County employees and their ability to assess the benefits and risks of receiving the COVID-19 vaccination and make the best decision for themselves and their families;

WHEREAS, we the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors believe that no person should be mandated or coerced to receive the COVID-19 vaccine as a condition of their employment or continued employment;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors that Lincoln County will not adopt any polices that mandate or coerce employees to receive the COVID-19 vaccination as a condition of their employment or continued employment.
