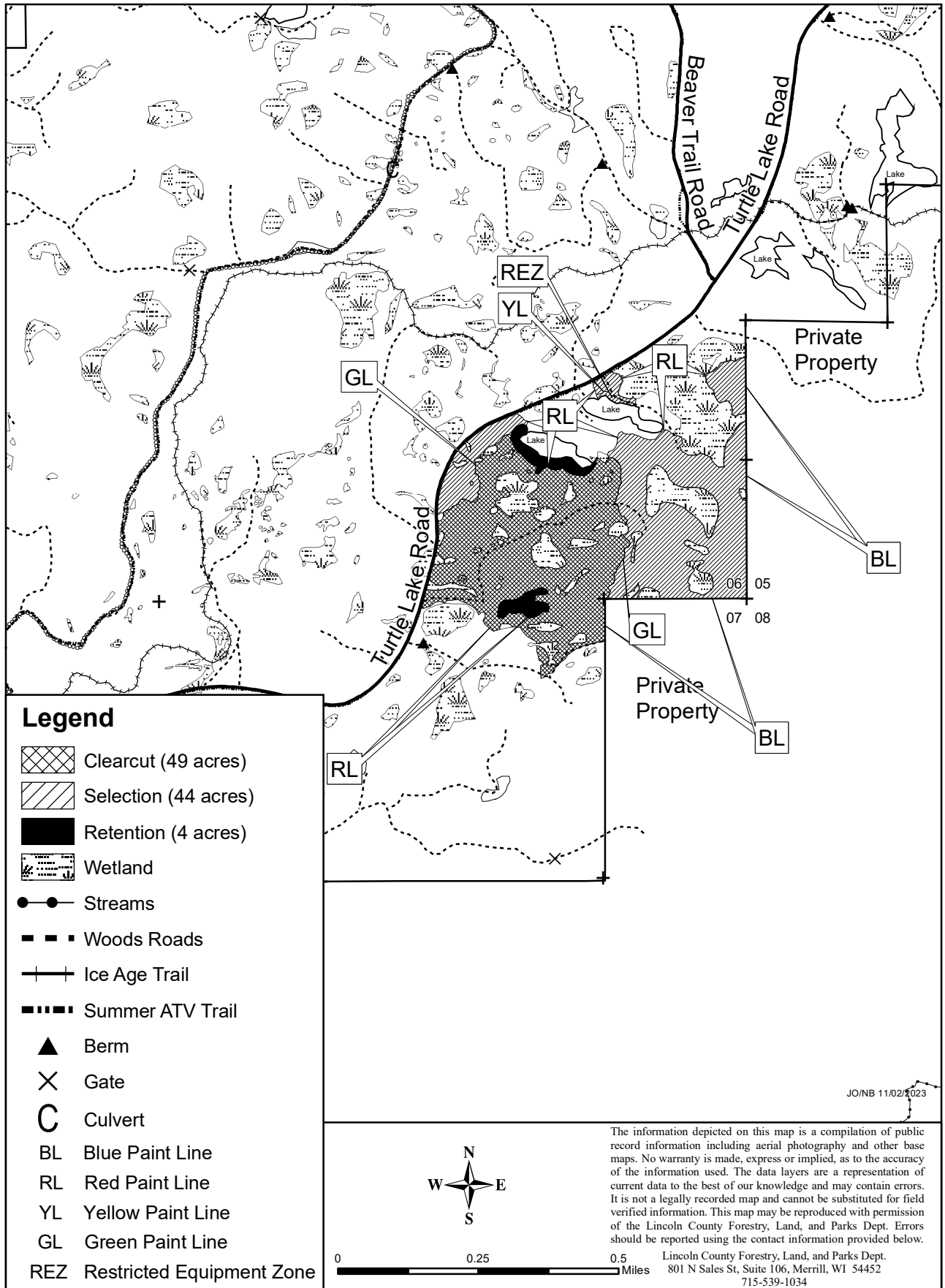

CONTRACT AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION

- 1) Clearcut area: cut all living trees > 1 inch in diameter except for yellow birch, oak, butternut, spruce, tamarack, pine, cedar, cherry, hemlock, apple, and hawthorn. Do not cut non-merchantable trees in low wet areas and drainages. Pockets of non-merchantable fir that will not impede aspen regeneration may be left uncut with prior approval from the Lincoln County Forestry Department. Selection harvest area: cut all ironwood, all merchantable aspen, all merchantable balsam fir, orange paint marked trees, and all trees inside of the delineated canopy gaps. Canopy gaps are delineated by purple paint marked trees located on the gap's perimeter. A purple V faces the inside of the canopy gap. DO NOT cut Blue, Purple, Green, or Red marked trees. Avoid damage to residual trees. Snags and dead trees are only to be cut if leaving them standing presents a safety hazard to the harvesting operation. Snags and dead trees cut for safety reasons must be left in the harvest area and may not be utilized.
- 2) Selection harvest area is limited to shortwood skidding only.
- 3) Selection harvest area: Special care must be taken to limit damage to advanced regeneration. All spring poles (saplings tipped over from harvesting operations) will be cut at the base.
- 4) Wheeled or tracked equipment is prohibited in the restricted equipment zone (REZ), unless agreed upon in writing. Biomass harvesting within the REZ is prohibited.
- 5) Do not operate equipment within 15 feet of the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM), ephemeral ponds, and wetlands unless the ground is firm or frozen. Do not operate equipment within 15 feet of lakes.
- 6) All logging damage/debris must be corrected/removed from trails, woods roads, and grass openings daily and prior to sale closure. Slash will be left where it falls unless the contractor wishes to use it to prevent ruts, soil compaction and erosion during logging operations.
- 7) Any roadwork will require prior approval from the Lincoln County Forestry Department and must follow BMP guidelines. Contractor is responsible for installing broad based dips, water bars and/or using other soil stabilizing techniques where appropriate.
- 8) Ingress and egress to this sale is the responsibility of the contractor.
- 9) Gates/Berms removed or damaged by the contractor must be restored to original or better condition when the sale becomes inactive and upon sale completion.
- 10) Hemlock requirements: Cut all hemlock in canopy gaps and all marked with orange paint. Utilization of hemlock is not required but any utilized volume will be paid for at a rate of \$2.00/ton. Hemlock trees not utilized must be laid flat on the ground with limbs lopped or broken to reduce fire hazard.
- 11) Mixed hardwood pulp weight estimate is approximately: 10% birch. Mixed hardwood sawlog volume estimate is approximately: 60% red maple, 20% hard maple, 16% white ash, and 1% black ash.
