This 47 mile long trail system is a two-way trail primarily utilizing existing logging roads that traverse the area of the Lincoln County Forest known as the Harrison Hills.

Due to the hilly topography in this area, the trail has many sharp curves and steep segments. These terrain features not only make the Harrison Hills Trail scenic but result in a trail that may be challenging for some riders. This trail is certainly NOT a high speed trail. Stay on trail, out of wetlands and respect private property.

Unless posted closed; the ATV trail system opens May 1st (trail condition dependent) and the majority of the system closes December 1st of each year. Most of the ATV trail system is also open to road licensed vehicles, mountain bikers, hikers, and other recreationists. The summer ATV trail segments north of County Rd D intersecting with Theis Rd and Bowman Rd are gated and not open to highway licensed vehicles. Immediately north of County Rd D, the ATV trail crosses private property. The segment of the trail west of intersection #10 also crosses private property. These trail segments crossing private land are ONLY open to ATV/UTV use and are closed earlier than Dec 1st.

Per Lincoln County Ordinance:
Ch: 16.08(3)(a)1

"No person shall drive in excess of 10 miles per hour on any portion of an approved all-terrain vehicle trail that is posted with a yellow sign indicating "slow", "steep hill", "dip", "turn" or other yellow caution sign."

The trail between Keg Road and Intersection #10 closes October 15th each year.

Trail segments that close November 1st each year:
Between Intersection #312 and #313 (County Rd D and Hills Lake Road).
From Intersection #310 West to County Rd B.

It is your responsibility to know which county roads and town roads are open to ATV/UTV use. Please contact the local official.

**In an Emergency
Know Your Location**



Brown and white signs indicate the locations of important intersections found throughout the trail system. If there is an emergency call 911. Tell the dispatcher your location relative to these intersection numbers. The Emergency Response System will direct rescue personnel to your location based on these numbers.

Gated trails restrict road licensed vehicle use; however, a bypass allows for the current maximum legal ATV/UTV width of 65 inches.
