SPECAL ADMINISTRATION GUIDELINES

NOTE: This guideline is provided only as a public service and is not meant to be legal advice. The Register in Probate office cannot give legal advice; please contact an attorney if you have legal questions.

TO OPEN A SPECIAL ADMINISTRATION Complete and file the following:

PR - 1850	Special Administration Petition
PR - 1806	Proof of Heirship
PR - 1807	Consent to Serve
PR - 1840	Waiver and Consent (Formal Administration)
PR - 1852	Order for Special Administration
PR - 1853	Letters of Special Administration
Original	Will and any Codicils (unless already filed with the Court)

^{**}The Court will determine whether a not hearing will be required. If the Court requires a hearing, you must complete and file the originals of the following:

PR - 1851	Special Administration Order Setting Time to Hear Petition
PR - 1817	Affidavit of Mailing

TO CLOSE A SPECIAL ADMINISTRATION Complete and file the following:

PR - 1814	Estate Account (If required by the Court)
PR - 1854	Petition for Discharge of Special Administrator
PR - 1855	Order Discharging Special Administrator

- **FILING THE FORMS:** Be sure to complete ALL applicable sections of <u>each</u> form, including the "powers" section on both PR-1852 and PR-1853.
- BOND: May be required before Letters are issued; determination made by the Court.
- CERTIFIED COPIES: \$3.00 for the certification and \$1.00 for each page copied and compared.
 If requested through the mail, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope together with the correct fee.
- **FILING FEE:** A Statutory Inventory Filing Fee of 0.2% of the assets, or a minimum of \$20.00 if the assets are less than \$10,000, is due at the time of filing the Petition.
